<u>Aluminum cast and diecast production favorable in July</u>

The Ministry of Economy, Trade and Industry recently revealed the production of aluminum cast and aluminum diecast in July. According to the report, the production of aluminum cast in July rose 2.8% from a year earlier to 38,830 ton, and that of aluminum diecast increased 2.8% to 91,100 ton.

Comparing with the same month a year ago, the aluminum cast showed the first increase in past four months. The diecast increased successively for three months.

On page two chart, from left July, June and comparison with a year ago. From top cast totaled, machines, cars, others, diecast totaled, machines, electric appliances, automobile, motorbike and others.

<u>"Metal Osaka" is held</u>

U.S. dollar hits six-year high against yen

The U.S. dollar rose to six-year high of ¥109.46 on September 19 in Tokyo, reaching levels unseen since the collapse of Lehman Brothers Holding Inc. after the U.S. Federal Reserve raised its outlook for the trajectory of its key interest rate.

The yen fell as Bank of Japan Gov. Haruhiko Kuroda reiterated comments on money easing. On the other hand at Tokyo Stock Market, the Nikkei stock index rose to a record high in this year.

The lower yen has various impacts against our economic activities and civil life. We import most materials, fuel and foods, all which go up prices as high as U.S. dollar, and bring the increase of costs and the shrinkage of consumption.

Regarding aluminum business, all primary aluminum and silicon metal are imported, and the impact of lower yen is worried.

The left chart on page three shows the movement of yen against U.S. dollar, above, and the Nikkei stock index at Tokyo Stock Exchange, below. The right chat shows the change rates of some currencies for past one month. From left U.S. dollar, pound, Indonesia rupiah, Korea won, Euro, Australia dollar, Brazil real and yen.

<u>The Japan of today</u> The Mount Ontake eruption

The Mount Ontake, straddles Gifu and Nagano prefectures, abruptly erupted around noon on September 27, and since then the eruption activity goes on actively. When the volcano erupted, the area near its 3,067 meter peak was crowded with some 300 climbers who had come to see the tinted autumnal leaves.

A great volume of hot volcanic ash and cinders left at least 51 climbers confirmed dead and dozens more injured.

The search and rescue has involved about 1,000 police officers, fire fighters and Self-Defense Forces personnel, however the activity has been sometimes interrupted by the dense volcano gas, gummy wet ash and bad weather at the peak area.

The Meteorological Agency has been watching Mount Ontaka by using a system to measure changes in its shape as well as a clinometer, seismograph and a camera with telescope, but the prediction of eruption was impossible. It has reminded us that Japan is indeed a country with many volcanoes that could erupt unexpectedly.
