I think that only one business would be effective to stop hollowing out, moving to overseas. This year will be crucial to exist in 21 century for us, I believe.

I hope everyone at diecast business will be in good health and enjoy excellent business results in 2015.

War and a youngster

It has past 70 years since the Pacific War ended. Those who experienced and realized the war will disappear soon. As one of survivors, I would like to speak a short story, my experienced war.

Looking upon my growth period, there were the Manchury Incident (1931) – kindergartner; the Shanghai Incident (1932) – kindergartner; the China Incident (1937)-primary pupil; the Pacific War (1941)- J. high student; Japan surrendered (1945) – college student. Thus I grew up with wars and free from peace. I eyewitnessed the wars and the citizen life through my youngster's eye. Though I was one of normal boys, I realized the decline of national power got clearer year by year. The commodities at shops were decreasing obviously, and at last dis appeared just before the end of war.

War and a lad

In 1945 all high school and college students were forcibly sent to munition factories to make up the deficit of workers. I worked for Tokyo Aero Gauge Co. as a student worker. At midnight on May 25, many US bombers attacked Tokyo and at last my boarding house was bombed by fireballs.

At that time, I was at the second floor, and seeing the sheets of flames of the first floor, I gave up downstair. I was obliged to jump off from a window onto the garden. With so many people, I ran and evacuated toward more safety area, and fortunately, we made it over into the garden of Meiji Shrine without being caught by fire. There, many evacuated people and I waited dawn. Becoming composed, I noticed that the right half of my face got burnt and ached, but there were no doctor and no medicine.

In the morning, I received only one rice ball and a train ticket, and could return home in Nishio without any belongings. In this way, most citizens lost everything by frequent air-raid fires in Tokyo and major cities. Today, I wonder why so many rice ball could be arranged at that time under such a hard air-attack, and at that night, the flames crawl and flow so rapidly on the ground surface, I realized.

The darkest days

The five years, from the end of war, 1945, till the outbreak of the Korean War, 1950, were the darkest days in Japan, I experienced.

I suppose that any historians never want to face up and to write out this worst period. Though some were kept during wartime, the break-down of law and order began as soon as the war ended. Government's control of prices and distribution couldn't work well, and at the same time, the spiral inflation attacked us instead of the US air-attack. In 1946 government restricted to pay bank savings against the swelling cash, but the economic situation went on worse and worse.

Every price freeze policy had no effect, and the price up during post-war five years reached really 50 times, by which the citizen life was dropped to the worst bottom. However fortunately, the Korean War occurred and the US post-war policy turned away. The purged leaders came back, and the big orders for the war enriched all Japan economy, which gave the chance to our rehabilitation.

At the battlefield, by the air-attack or under the poorest circumstances, many promising friends passed away. I can never forget these unhappy memories.
