In addition to his warm personality, he was also an honest and down-toearth person.

It was supposed to be a grand funeral with many people from the political and business world, but it was held as a family funeral with only his close relatives in consideration of the outbreak of Covid-19 Virus.

I was also surprised to know this from President Takashi Amano after the funeral and I was truly disappointed. However, I was told that "he very next year will be the 80th anniversary of Asuka Industries, and we would like to hold a memorial ceremony President Hisashi".

Mr. Takashi Amano, is currently serving as the Vice President, but Mr. Hisashi also served as a

member and officer of the Nishio Chamber of Commerce and Industry for long years, including 31 years as a member (from November 1973 to October 2004) and 28 years as a standing member (from December 1976 to October 2004).

In 1980, Mr.Hisashi became the chairman of our Overseas Affairs Committee, and in anticipation of the domestic distribution revolution that was to come, he organized an overseas market research team to visit Australia and New Zealand in 1981 as part of a survey of developed countries.

In addition, for 16 years from 1998 to 2005, he supported the management of small businesses from a financial perspective as a member of the screening committee for the Marukei Loan, a fund for improving the management of small businesses provided by the Japan Finance Corporation.

He was also a member of the Nishio Rotary Club from 1965 to 2001, and became the chairman.

In the year of 1985, which was succeeded by his son, President Takashi, who became the chairman in 2020.

Company lasts forever, and I would like to emulate the way in which Chairman Hisashi had been able to keep abreast of developments in the world in the big picture,

and smoothly pass on his management skills to his son, President Takashi.
